CLUBS UPDATE

A reminder that Autumn Clubs finish on 8th December. There are no afterschool clubs the last week of term.

Choir will continue into the spring term and parents do not need to re-apply. Due to the Young Voices event, Choir will start with an extra practice on Thursday 4th January, then weekly from Wednesday 10th January.

We are currently putting together the clubs list for Spring Term and have some new external clubs starting. Booking for school-led clubs will open the first week of the new term, with clubs starting week commencing Tuesday 16th January (Monday 15th is an INSET day). YEAR 6 TRIP—HENLEY FORT

Year 6 had an amazing time at Henley Fort for their **WW2 immersive day**. The trip started with an uphill climb to the fort which is the highest point in Guildford. The children wore authentic uniforms and took on the roles of both a Home Guard Volunteer and an Air Raid Warden.

The Air Raid Wardens experienced what it was like during an air raid in an Anderson Shelter. They learnt about gas masks, blackouts and how to fight fire.

The Home Guard hunted for sneaky spies, practiced drills and how to defeat the enemy.



YEAR 4 UFTON COURT TRIP

Year 4 went to Ufton Court this week to enrich their learning about Ancient Greece in history. They had the opportunity to become traders in Ancient Greece, compete in a mini-Olympics with the chance to be crowned victors for their city state and they got to be judge and jury to decide different crimes and punishments in Ancient Greece. They all had a fantastic day!



YEAR 2 VICTORIAN WORKSHOP

Year 2 enjoyed a visit from Mrs O's workshops where they experienced life in a Victorian School.

The girls were sat separate to boys, they wrote on a slate board, learnt about the three R's (reading,

writing and arithmetic) and repeated by rote the 'Rules for Pupils'.



They experienced some Victorian era punishments: Two children were told to wear the Dunces Hat as they got a question wrong; one child was given the finger stocks to help him stop fidgeting; and some children even 'received' the cane for bringing a toy into the classroom.

The children loved experiencing what life

was like for Victorian children and are now using this experience to write about the Victorian Era in History.


A huge thank you must go to the Friends of Wyke for part funding some of these enrichment experiences for the children. Contributions

SURREY LOCAL AUTHORITY UPDATES

This week we have received two important updates from Surrey.

Education, Health and Care needs assessments process

Liz Mills (Surrey Director of Education and Lifelong Learning) has written an open letter to families regarding the current delays in the Education, Health and Care needs assessment process. The full letter is available on the Surrey Local Offer website.

Mindworks Neurodiversity offer

(for children over 6 years who are not already under a neurodevelopment assessment pathway)

If your child is over 6 years old and you have discussed a possible neurodevelopment assessment with Mrs Andrews this term, you will be aware that the Mindworks referral process for this is currently closed to new applications. We have been advised that there is going to be a new form and screening pack for schools to complete for all new referrals to Mindworks. This is due to be shared with schools in November 2023 (we have not yet received this).

We are still expecting Mindworks referrals to reopen in December 2023 but a date for this has not been confirmed. As soon as we have the details of the new form and screening pack, Mrs Andrews will contact the relevant families to agree on the next steps for their children.

MEASLES RESURGENCE

Is your child up to date with both does of their measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine?

The South East is currently seeing a steady rise in the number of cases of Measles. More information is available at MEASLES - Don't let your child catch it

Measles symptoms include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms. More details are on the NHS website.

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice.



SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL ENCOURAGES RESIDENTS TO OFFER SUPPORTED LODGINGS/FOSTER

Nationally, there are currently over 70,000 children living with carer families in the UK. However, there is still a significant shortage of Supported Lodgings and foster carers, with around 9,265 new carer families needed in the next year alone. In Surrey, there are over 1,000 children in care and Surrey County Council have just under 400 carer families.

If you have ever thought about fostering, or offering Supported Lodgings, now is the time to take that first step and find out more. The more people who consider caring, the greater the chance of finding loving, stable homes for children in Surrey who desperately need them.
